

2006-2007 General Rules and Regulations for the Pre Denver Circuit and National Western AQHA Shows

PREAMBLE: National Western Stock Show is organized and operated exclusively for educational purposes, and sponsors, producers and presents exhibitions of livestock, livestock products and the like, for children, adults, and the public. These exhibitions educate the livestock industry, members of Stock Show, and general public in better breeding, feeding and care of livestock and, Stock Show arranges for the judging and presentation of premiums, prizes, diplomas and the like, in continuation of such exhibitions and/or shows. *The Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association works with the National Western Stock Show to present exhibition and educational opportunities.*

1. All exhibitors in the Horse Show classes will be under the control and direction of the management of the National Western Stock Show, Rodeo & Horse Show, but the National Western Stock Show, Rodeo & Horse Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association in no case will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, stolen, destroyed or in any way injured. Every individual, either personally or through their partner, or guardian, who participated in the National Western Stock Show, Rodeo & Horse Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association, to any extent whatsoever, does thereby consent, for all purposes, that venue and jurisdiction shall lie in Denver County, Colorado. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by or arising from any horse or article owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the National Western Stock Show, Rodeo & Horse Show and Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association against all legal or other proceedings, claims, or demands of any kind or nature, in regard thereto, or that may arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse or article.

A. CONDUCT- Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, groom, driver or rider of any horse on exhibition will disqualify such horse for adjudication and the exhibitor shall forfeit all fees. Further action may be taken at the discretion of the Horse Show Manager.

B. Unsportsmanlike conduct by any exhibitor, trainer or rider will not be tolerated and violators may be excused from the arena. National Western and the Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association has an animal care and use committee to monitor the health and welfare of animals. Inhumane treatment - No person on show grounds, including but not limited to, barns, stalls, parking area and show arena, may treat a horse in an inhumane manner, which includes, but not limited to: Placing an object in the horses mouth so to cause undue discomfort or distress; Tying a horse in a manner as to cause undue discomfort or distress; or, letting blood from a horse. Poling WILL NOT be permitted at this show. See US Equestrian Federation Rule GR 806. National Western Stock Show will comply with and enforce the 1979 Horse Protection Act. Public Law 92-540. The Show Management may bar violators from further participation for the remainder of the Show.

C. Prohibited Substance, Drug Testing, Sabotage, Tampering, Inhumane Treatment. Stock Show and Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association reserves the right to question the alteration of any animal's physical or physiological structure. As a condition of participation in the National Western Stock Show or Pre Denver Horse Show, Participant agrees to submit to Stock Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association, at their discretion, any animal so entered for immediate testing. Test(s) may include, but not limited to blood, tissue and urine. Participant(s) further agrees that the conclusions reached by Stock Show shall be final, without recourse against Stock Show. A Participant of any animal(s) producing an analysis with a prohibited substance, sabotage, tampering, unethical fitting or inhumane practices will be barred from future competition at the National Western Stock Show.

2. STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY

AT NO TIME, NATIONAL WESTERN, ROCKY MOUNTAIN QUARTER HORSE ASSOCIATION, ITS EMPLOYEES AND OR AGENTS WILL TAKE CARE, CUSTODY OR CONTROL OF ANY HORSES, LIVESTOCK AND OR PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THE EXHIBITOR. AT ALL TIMES THE EXHIBITOR AND OR OWNER, ITS EMPLOYEES, ASSOCIATES AND OR AGENTS WILL HAVE FULL CONTROL, CUSTODY AND WILL CARE, FEED AND KEEP SAFE THEIR HORSES, LIVESTOCK AND PERSONAL PROPERTY, ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF NATIONAL WESTERN AND THE SHOW MANAGEMENT

No rollerblades, skateboards or scooters allowed. No motorized utility vehicles, like a 4-wheeler, golf cart, etc., will be allowed on the National Western Complex grounds without prior written approval. Upon such written approval, each driver of such vehicle must be a valid licensed driver and must provide proof of liability insurance.

INDEMNITY The EXHIBITOR AND OR OWNER agrees to be responsible for and pay, indemnify, save and hold harmless National Western Stock Show, its Directors, Officers, Employees, Agents and the City and County of Denver, or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association against any and all loss, claims, cost and/or expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, resulting from any loss or any claims or legal action of any nature whatsoever, whether or not reduced to a judgment, for any liability of any nature whatsoever that may arise against the National Western Stock Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association as a result of the operation, and/or the use of the premises including any acts of the Exhibitor and or owner, its agents, employees, representatives, or invites or in connection with any of the rights or privileges granted by National Western Stock Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association to Exhibitor and or owner in this agreement and premium book, including any actions, without limitation, on any violation of patent, trademark, franchise, copyright, libel or defamation liability claim or suit including any claim or suit based upon the intentional, unintentional or negligent acts of the Exhibitor and or Owner, it's agents, servants, employees or invites. The Exhibitor and or owner further warrants that all copyright materials, to be performed or used during the term of this agreement, have been duly licensed or authorized by their copyright owners or agents and Exhibitor and or owner agrees to be responsible for all license and royalty fees incurred by reason of any performance or use of copyright materials and in addition to any provisions contained elsewhere in this agreement and premium book to indemnify and hold the National Western harmless from any and all losses and expenses incurred with regard thereto. The Exhibitor and or owner will not be obligated to indemnify, defend or hold National Western Stock Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association harmless from any claim or demand which arises solely out of the negligent act of failure to act by National Western, its officers or employees.

The Exhibitor and or owner will be responsible and pay for damages to the National Western Stock Show premises, facilities or equipment caused by, the Exhibitor, Owner its employees, associates and or agents for all activities of the Exhibitor while on the premises of National Western Stock Show.

Force Majeure and Governmental Regulation. In view of the fact that Stock Show and Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association is a nonprofit corporation depending to a great degree upon the contributions and services of a substantial number of donors and volunteers, as well as the benefits provided by Stock Show to the general public through education and related services as set forth in the Preamble to these General Rules and Regulations, Stock Show and Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association deems it appropriate and prudent to be excused from liability, as set forth below in this paragraph, in the event of early cancellation of its events, operations and activities by reason of force majeure and/or governmental regulation. Accordingly, the following shall apply to the operations and activities conducted by the Stock Show:

WARNING: Under Colorado Law, an equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to section 13-21-119 Colorado revised statutes.

Force Majeure. Stock Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association shall not be liable for any delay or failure to perform its operations, activities, shows and events to the extent such delay or failure results from a force majeure occurrence. A force majeure occurrence is defined as any occurrence arising from causes beyond the reasonable control of Stock Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association and which delays or prevents performance by Stock Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association otherwise required by this Agreement, including but not limited to any (i) breakage or accident to equipment, machinery or facilities; (ii) any strikes, lock-outs or other labor difficulties; (iii) statutes, ordinances, regulations, orders, or rules issued by governmental authorities; (iv) judicial decrees or orders; (v) acts of God; (vi) animal diseases and/or quarantines; (vii) wars, riots or insurrections; (viii) civil disobediences, public

demonstrations or sabotage; (ix) fires, floods, explosions or inclement weather; (x) inability to obtain necessary labor, materials, supplies, utilities or transportation; (xi) depressions, recessions or other economic downturns; (xii) embargoes or energy shortages; or (xiii) other causes beyond Stock Show's reasonable control.

Governmental Regulation. Stock Show or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association shall not be liable for any delay or failure to perform its operations, activities, shows and events to the extent such delay or failure results from Stock Show's good faith compliance with applicable governmental statutes, ordinances, regulations, orders, rules or other directives, including but not limited to compliance with governmental directives concerning public health and safety, animal disease prevention detection and response, including animal quarantine and/or destruction; and protection of the environment.

3. Management reserves the right to adjust start times and/or rearrange classes if necessary to compensate for excessive entries or time shortages. Classes with drawn order will have the draw posted at the warm-up arena. National Western or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association reserves the right to make substitutions of judges or officials if deemed necessary.

4. National Western Horse Show Management or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association reserves the right to cap or limit entries in one or more divisions. Stall reservations with full payment received by December 1 will be processed by postmark. This will be a consideration if the show must be capped. Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, and/or to cancel any entries, also to disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel awards of prizes, without claims for damage.

5. National Western or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association shall not knowingly exclude disabled exhibitors from showing who are in compliance with national association rules, National Western Stock Show Rules and Regulations and who have appropriate licenses and documentation.

6. Entries:

A. Entries for the 2006-2007 AQHA horse show open on Monday, October 16, 2006. ALL HORSE SHOW ENTRIES for the AQHA Division held December 30 – January 8 WILL CLOSE two classes prior to the class being held unless otherwise stated. Exhibitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their Agents in preparation of entries. All Canadian and international exhibitors must pay all fees in United States funds. Any exhibitor issuing a check for payment of entries, stall or passes which does not clear their account for any reason will have five (5) days in which to make payment to keep entries eligible to participate in the National Western, with a \$50.00 additional charge assessed. Badges, exhibitor parking passes and back numbers may be picked up during regular horse show office hours beginning Friday, December 29, 2006.

B. VET-OUTS: Any vet-out received after December 15, will have entry fees ONLY refunded. Exhibitors canceling entries without a veterinarian's certificate shall forfeit all fees.

C. Numbers - All entry form data must be completely and accurately completed before each horse will be assigned a number. This number must be prominently displayed by the exhibitor whenever the horse is in the ring.

D. Entry Office Hours

1. The Pre Denver and National Western Horse Show Entry Office – AQHA Division, in the Events Center, will be open December 29, 2006 to January 8, 2007 daily from 6:30 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Coliseum events – see separate hours.

2. All post entries, class substitutions, rider substitutions, etc. must be made during these hours.

E. Stallions - Junior exhibitors will not be allowed to ride, drive or handle stallions in any class except as provided for in breed division rules. Stallions may not be shown in AQHA Novice Amateur classes. Stallions may be shown by anyone in other classes in every division.

7. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

A. Out of State Origin

1) Health Certificate - Required and must be turned into Animal Health Official, Entrance Superintendent or Stalling Superintendent for the Stock Show at time of arrival and must be dated

no more than 30 days from time of arrival. Horses entering a show will be subject to examination by the State Veterinarian's office upon entry or during said show. Any animal found showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases may be immediately withdrawn from the show and held in quarantine at owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until properly released in order to return to owner's premises following treatment.

2) Negative test for Equine Infectious Anemia (AGID or Elisa) required and must be turned into Animal Health Official or Stalling Superintendent for the Pre Denver/Stock Show at time of stall assignment and must be dated no more than one (1) year from date of arrival.

B. Colorado Origin

1) Health Certificate-Required and must be turned into Animal Health Official, Entrance Superintendent or Stalling Superintendent for the Pre Denver/Stock Show at the time of arrival and must be dated no more than 30 days from time of arrival. Horses entering a show will be subject to examination by the State Veterinarian's office upon entry or during said show. Any horse found showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases may be immediately withdrawn from the show and held in quarantine at owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until properly released in order to return to owner's premises following treatment.

2) Equine Infectious Anemia - No Test required.

C. Vesicular Stomatitis (VSM)

Annual notices on Vesicular Stomatitis will be issued prior to the event as requested by the Colorado State Veterinarian's Office. We appreciate all exhibitors participation in state mandated policies.

8. BRAND REQUIREMENTS

A. Out of State Exhibitors

1) All livestock coming from mandatory brand inspection states must have a current brand inspection certificate. The original copy of the inspection certificate must be turned in with the health certificate. All animals found to be improperly shipped will be held until released by the state of origin.

2) All out of state exhibitors coming into Colorado for the Pre Denver/National Western Stock Show from NON-MANDATORY INSPECTION STATES must have proof of title accompanying the stock to and from Pre Denver/National Western Stock Show whether for exhibition or sale. Legal proof of title would be any of the following:

a) Registration papers

b) Legal bill of sale properly witnessed. The requirements of a legal bill of sale are:

* Sellers name;

* Buyer's name;

* Complete description of stock being purchased (the complete description should

include the number of head, color, sex, breed markings, registration numbers and hot brands.

* Signature of seller;

* Signature of buyer, and

* Notarized affidavit stating that the animal(s) being transported and/or exhibited are

of your raising.

B. Colorado Exhibitors

All Colorado exhibitors must have a brand inspection certificate ONLY ON PURCHASED LIVESTOCK (Horses, cattle, mules & donkeys). If exhibiting animals of your own raising, proof of title is any of the following:

1) Colorado recorded brand on the animal(s)

2) Registration papers

3) Notarized affidavit stating that the animal(s) being exhibited are of your raising

4) A current Colorado brand inspection certificate

9. ARRIVAL PROCEDURE

Horses must enter National Western grounds via Gate 7, Entry Road located on Brighton Blvd, Trailers will be directed to the unloading area by Pre Denver/National Western Staff. Upon arrival stall assignments will be made through the Horse Show Office/Stalling Superintendent, Health

papers must be submitted upon arrival. After unloading, trucks and trailers must promptly be moved to designated parking areas. Unloading/Loading time limit is one hour.

10. Stalls:

A. Stall reservations will not be accepted without payment. Every Horse is required to stall. Stalls will be assigned by the Stalling Superintendent/Show Office. Horses must be placed in the assigned stalls and no change will be permitted without consent of the superintendent. Horses not entered in the show will not receive a stall! Vacated or unused stalls will be returned to facility inventory for re-use without compensation.

B. Requests for adjoining stalls from different owners will not be honored unless requested on each owner's entry form, and sent in same envelope. Stall assignments will be available when horses arrive at the gate. Horses placed in stalls not assigned to them will be moved by Stalling Superintendent or National Western Horse Show Management.

C. Exhibitors may reserve ONE tack stall for every four horses entered. No more than five tack stalls may be reserved.

D. Exhibitors are not allowed to move other owner's horses from stalls. If horses are not out of stalls at assigned times, they will be moved by Management.

E. If a horse is entered in more than one breed/division, a stall fee for each division must be paid. Owners from out of state, having horses in more than one breed/division will have to find stalling off grounds for the horses not currently showing. A list of off grounds stalling facilities can be provided for your convenience. Please call them for early arrivals.

F. ALL HORSES MUST ARRIVE AND DEPART according to POSTED schedule. THANK YOU FOR YOUR COOPERATION.

G. All horses will be under the supervision and care of their owners. Horse Exhibitors are required to keep their stall and the aisles clear and neat. Stall Emergency contact cards are available in the show office and stalling office for posting on stalls. LOCKS ON HORSE STALLS ARE NOT ALLOWED.

H. The stalls are 8' x 10' in the Events Center and 10' x 10' in the Expo Hall, all stall doors are provided. National Western will charge \$15.00 per panel for such removal. This must be paid by the exhibitor. No alteration of stall walls will be allowed, any damages will be the sole responsibility of the exhibitor.

I. BARN CLEAN-UP All exhibitors will be required to dump manure in National Western designated areas to help in quick removal. It is also requested by National Western Staff that all alley ways be watered to help keep down the dust in the barns. If rules are not strictly adhered to, the Show Management has the right to request any exhibitor to vacate the show grounds. This rule will be strictly enforced by National Western Stock Show Management.

J. STALLING OFFICE HOURS

1. The Horse Show Stalling Office, in the Events Center, will remain open 24 hours a day beginning January 6, 2007. Grounds releases are issued from the Horse Show Stalling Office.

11. FEED AND BEDDING

A. Feed of all kinds will be available through the Feed Concessionaire on National Western Grounds. Exhibitors may bring their own hay and grain mix if desired. Exhibitors are required to store NO MORE than two days supply of hay in the barns at any one time.

B. Bedding- Wood Chips or Shavings only.

1. Must be purchased through the on grounds concessionaire.

2. Straw/paper shavings are not allowed in the barns/stalls.,

C. Exhibitors are required to pay at time of delivery or leave an open check with concessionaire.

12. ARENA & WARM UP SCHEDULES

Arena warm up schedules and night schooling will be posted at the Paddock Stand, Horse Show Entry Office and Stalling Office. The Events Center main arena is 150' x 300', the paddock arena is 85' x 185' and the Stadium Arena is 90' x 190'. The footing in all arenas is a mix of 20% sand and 80% loam.

13. RING PROCEDURES

The show ring will be under absolute control of Show Management. Only qualified persons will be allowed in the ring during judging. Due notice will be served upon all exhibitors as to the time classes will be called, and all horses must be ready and waiting to enter the ring promptly. When the gates are closed and the judge has started work, no exhibitor who is late will be admitted.

It is the tradition of the show ring that an exhibitor be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and horses properly presented. The Show Management may at its discretion, bar an entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

14. Classes will be called according to the schedule. All horses must be ready and waiting to enter the arena promptly. Horses will not be allowed to enter the arena after the gates are closed and the judge has started to work. Exhibitors are responsible for informing the Paddock Master of tack changes or any other delay that may cause the exhibitor to be late and possibly miss his class. The gate will be held or a break taken where justified.

15. RELEASE INFORMATION

All exhibitors must obtain a release form before removing any livestock from National Western Grounds.

A. All releases must be obtained from Show Office or Stalling Superintendent's Office.

B. Must have Driver's License #, Vehicle color, make, License #, State, Trailer color, License #, State.

C. Obtain a "Paid Feed Bill" from feed office and present it to Stalling Superintendent for a release, and if necessary a brand release.

D. Upon release, horses will not be allowed back on the grounds. No "in and out passes" will be issued.

16. EXHIBITOR BADGES & PARKING PASSES:

A. Horse Exhibitor Badge

1. Cost is \$15.00 per badge

2. Includes general admission for the entire length of the Show, January 6-21, 2007.

3. Limit of 10 badges per horse shown.

4. Does not include entry into the lower level of Coliseum Arena

5. Includes entry into designated areas in the horse show arena in Events Center ONLY, with the exception of any ticketed performance. Please see the Horse Show Entry Office to request complimentary seats in the exhibitor seating section.

B. Official Show Badge - Collector's Edition

1. Cost is \$35.00

2. Includes general admission only for the entire length of the show, January 6-21, 2007.

3. Does not include entry into the lower level of Coliseum Arena.

4. Does not include entry into designated area in the horse show arena and exhibitor seating in the Events Center during ticketed performances.

5. This is a collector's edition badge. It does not carry any special privileges.

C. Parking and Barn Permits - Notice: Exhibitors please be advised parking and Barn permits MUST be situated in vehicle so as to be read from the exterior at all times. Vehicles not possessing correct or expired permits may be towed at owner's expense. NO EXCEPTIONS!

D. Any owner, trainer or exhibitor who has purchased parking passes or exhibitor passes and cancels entries for any reason will not be able to use parking passes or exhibitor passes if they do not have another horse entered into the show.

17. EXHIBITOR SEATING

Sections 2 & 3 will be available for exhibitor seating. To sit in this area a horse exhibitor badge and specially issued ticket is required. These exhibitor tickets are available for those participating in that specific performance, and are available in the horse show entry office. Tickets will be limited to six (6) tickets per horse competing in each performance.

18. DECORATIONS

Stall decorations must not block any aisle ways and must be fire retardant with a certificate on hand verifying such. Blocking or partial blocking of aisles is prohibited. Sufficient room must be left open to allow for 2-way horse traffic. Violation will affect stabling assignments.

19. SIGNS

Breed Association Shows and Sales are held within the confines of the National Western grounds. National Western, therefore, reserves all rights to any advertising, signage, announcements, etc., made on behalf of sponsors and supporters of the show. Accordingly, National Western will not permit any sponsor advertising, signage, announcements, etc., other than those rights contracted directly with the National Western or Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association relative to the Pre Denver event. Breed Associations, members and exhibitors are, therefore, prohibited from providing exposure during their respective events held here at the National Western for sponsors they have obtained without written permission of the National Western.

Signs on stalls CANNOT advertise commercial ventures or products. Stall signs must advertise farms, ranches, and stable only. Stable name signs with Incorporated Commercial products must have prior approval from the Horse Show Manager. Show Management reserves the right to remove signs in violation with the above rule.

The Western Stock Show Association places great value upon the NW logo and all variations of the National Western name. Therefore, as of the 1993 show, the Association implemented a licensing program to control the use of the NW logo and all National Western names and ensure the compliance with specific quality standards for all merchandise.

In accordance with this policy, the Association reserves the right to pursue appropriate legal action to stop the distribution and sale of merchandise that is not covered by a license. As part of this annual licensing program, the Association must approve the quality of merchandise that bears its name and trademarks and determine royalties due to the Association upon the granting of such license.

WE HAVE SELECTED VENDORS OF CERTAIN TYPES OF MERCHANDISE AND HAVE EXCLUSIVE LICENSE AGREEMENTS WITH THOSE VENDORS FOR ALL ON-GROUNDS SALES OF SUCH NATIONAL WESTERN LOGO MERCHANDISE. THEREFORE, ALL OTHER ON-GROUND VENDORS ARE PROHIBITED FROM SELLING OR DISTRIBUTING ANY AND ALL NATIONAL WESTERN LOGO MERCHANDISE.

The National Western looks forward to your cooperation with the Association in helping to protect its valuable trademarks and maintaining the high quality of merchandise that bear them.

National Western reserves the right to use exhibitor and livestock images, portraits and likeness as captured by official NWSS photographers for promotions, advertising and marketing endeavors.

20. ALCOHOL

In accordance with the Colorado State Liquor Code, and City of Denver Law, the National Western Stock Show, Rodeo & Horse Show prohibits the disbursement, sales, or bringing any non-permitted alcohol on grounds by a third party. Alcoholic beverages can be obtained from our in-house concessionaire, KM Concessions, located at various locations throughout the show grounds

21. PREMIUM MONEY

Premiums will be forwarded to the exhibitors, as soon after the close of the show as they can be properly processed. (Generally within 45 days). Cash premiums are payable by bank check. All premiums whatsoever, not claimed within 90 days upon receipt, shall be deemed forfeited to the Management or donors.

22. VIDEO CAMERAS

Video Cameras are not allowed at any National Western Horse Show. For video footage of an event, please pre arrange a filming with our videographer or visit their booth outside the Horse Show Entry Office.

23. DOGS

Due to requirements of the liability insurance carrier and policy of all major livestock shows, DOGS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED on the National Western Stock Show grounds, nor in National Western Buildings, including the Coliseum and Events Center, at any time. The Rocky Mountain Quarter Horse Association Board of Directors has approved a fine of \$25 on first offense and \$50 second offense. Third offense violators will be escorted from the grounds with no recourse to show management.

24. BABY STROLLERS

Baby strollers will not be allowed in the stable areas and are STRONGLY discouraged in other horse and livestock stalling areas. Please place all strollers in the provided "stroller corrals".

25. WHEELCHAIRS

Wheelchairs must be accompanied with an attendant in all horse and livestock stalling areas.

26. PROTEST

Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$100.00 cash or certified check with the Secretary, with sum to be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protest must be signed by the protester and must be filed in writing within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation, and will be handled in accordance with the appropriate breed association rules and regulations.

27. SALES HELD AT National Western Stock Show

A. Breed Association Sales

All sales being conducted by a breed association must be in accordance with the following state laws, and/or Breed Regulations:

- 1) Each consignor must be a member of the association sponsoring the sale.
- 2) All checks for purchase of stock must be payable to the association sponsoring the sale, NOT A SALE COMPANY.
- 3) All animals must be inspected and ownership proven prior to sale, by a Colorado Brand Inspector.
- 4) Each association must comply with Colorado Law concerning issuance of proper bills of sale, purchaser's invoices, and consignment records.
- 5) Sale catalogs must show lot number, complete description of each lot, owner's name and address.

B. Private sales are acceptable.
